

Why is planning necessary?

- Identifies methods to address risks prior to them impacting the community.
- Provides a guide to use during the response phase.
- Provides an opportunity to collaborate with key individuals.



Why is planning necessary?

 Ensures response actions are consistent with other agencies

The Planning Process

- ✓ Form a planning team
- ✓ Conduct research
- ✓ Analyze the information
- ✓ Determine goals, objectives and courses of action
- ✓ Write the plan

- ✓ Disseminate the plan
- ✓ Train & exercise
- ✓ Review, revise and maintain





Form a planning team

 Representatives of departments, agencies, private sector and NGOs that will execute the plan





Conduct Research

- Identify....
 - Potential hazards
 - Resources
 - Geographic,Topological andpopulation features
 - Historical events

- By....
 - Conducting HVA
 - Working with other agencies in municipality
 - Reviewing other plans
 - Reviewing websites, newspapers, talking with seasoned veterans



Analyze the Information

- Helps to decide
 - What hazards merit special attention
 - What actions must be planned for
 - What resources are likely to be needed
- Helps to identify cascading events
- Provides guide in determining priorities



Determine Goals & Objectives

- Priorities, Goals,
 Objectives
- SMART Objectives
- Based on Needs
 - Hazard
 - Response
 - Constraint





Develop Courses of Action & Identify Resources

- Generate possible solutions to achieve the goals and objectives
- Solutions based on planning concepts
 - Scenario Based
 - Functional Based
 - Capabilities Based



Write the Plan

- Use standard format
- Keep the language simple and clear
- Avoid using jargon
- Check for spelling & grammar

Approve & Implement

- Conformity with other plans
- Peer & superior review
- Presentation and Promulgation





Exercise the Plan

- Train
- Exercise
 - What type of exercises?



- Review exercise results
 - Is the plan;
 - Adequate?
 - Feasible?
 - Acceptable?
 - Complete?
 - Compliant?



Review, Revise, Maintain the Plan

- Establish and follow review cycle
 - No more than 24 months



- Review after
 - Change in response resources
 - Update of planning guidance or standards
 - Change in elected officials (train new EOs)
 - After activation or exercise

Notification & Resource Manual

- Key personnel, CI/KR
- Dynamic document
- Reviewed / Update frequently
- Signature Page







Hazard Specific Checklists

- Jump start the response
- Based on hazards identified in HVA
- Checklist for each section chief




Job Aids / FOGS
